About us:

The MSC is a bowling venue for fifty and older players, female or male. Please note that all participants must be at LEAST 50 years of age on the day of the tournament to compete.

Dues & Fees:

The MSC offers 10 Events per year, August through May. Entry Fees for each tournament are \$90 for Members and \$100 for Non-Members. The MSC Membership is \$45 per participant each season. Non-member fees are not applicable to the membership fee. Cash is the preferred method of entry fees. For first time entrants, checks will be accepted.

How it Works:

Payout is 1 for 2, same day. The format is 7 random match games, with an 8th game being a position round. The top 5 plus any seeds go into the stepladder. A 4 or 5 game Stepladder follows. When there are 4 or more Super Seniors or if there are 4 or More Real Old Guys, one must be in the ladder. There must be at least one bowler over 59 years of age in the ladder.

To cash, one must finish in the top 50% of one's age bracket, otherwise you **DO NOT** cash. Cashing will be based on 1 for 2 for each age bracket. Only exceptions: all players over 59 who finish in the natural prize list will cash.

Women are guaranteed a 1 for 2 pay out. If a woman finishes in the prize list naturally, the 1 for 2 for women payout is no longer effective.

The year-end tournament has added money to each payout position. To qualify for the year end event, a bowler must be a member and have played at **least 3** tournaments in the 2021-2022 season.

Any questions regarding payout and scoring will be left to the discretion of the Director.

Age Classifications:

50 through 59 is a "Regular"

60 through 67 is a "Super Senior" (SS)

68 and Older is a "Real Old Guy" (ROG).

One's age determines the bracket they are in.

Every tournament is certified by the USBC.

For the the second consecutive month, Tom Jones won.

This month at Bogarts, like TexaTonka last month, he found the line to success. He shot 1043 his last 4 games to move into second. While he was not the high qualifier in either event, once in the stepladder, he couldn't miss.

In this event, he defeated Dave Oulman in the semifinal and defeated top seed Scott Davis in the final, 250 to 223. With this win, he now has 3 MSC titles.

Davis was high qualifier with 1946. He began the tournament with a 300 and, really coasted from there. He averaged 233 on a pattern that the field averaged 202. This is his second runner up.

Oulman was looking for 5th title, having 4 on his resume. This was his third third place finish. He defeated Clark Poelzer to meet Jones . Oulman was lined up against Poelzer, as he shot 259 to Poelzers 191. This Poelzers 13th 4th place finish. Poelzer is the all time MSC leader with 71 top 5 finishes.

Oulman's match against Jones was close, as it was decided by 11 pins. Dave has 20 top 5 finishes.

Mike Wirz finished 5th. His 10th such finish to go with 8 MSC titles and 44 top five finishes. The match against Poelzer was decided in the 10th frame. Wirz finished with 224 to Poelzers 228.

The pattern, Route 66, V2, proved to be challenging as the field averaged 203.

Colonial Lanes will host us for the third tournament. Coincidentally, this will be the third MSC hosted by this fine center.
